**What is it?**

NFPA is the “National Federation of Paralegal Associations,” and its membership base includes paralegal associations and individual sustaining members from around the United States and military paralegals based around the world. The Dallas Area Paralegal Association (DAPA) has been an association member of the National Federation of Paralegal Associations (NFPA) since 1976.

NFPA holds an annual convention, which is hosted by a local association, each year. DAPA last hosted an NFPA convention in 1997 in Fort Worth, Texas.

DAPA is proud to be once again chosen to host NFPA’s Annual Convention and 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. During the convention, there will be a full-day of CLE for paralegals, several luncheons highlighting a keynote speaker, awards and recognitions, social events, and policy meetings. On Thursday, DAPA will host a full-day and four tracks of CLE and a student workshop. Friday will include NFPA Region meetings and a social event. NFPA is divided into 5 Regions. DAPA is in Region 2.

Saturday and Sunday are reserved for the policy meetings. The format of NFPA policy meetings are similar to congressional meetings where policies affecting the paralegal members and the paralegal convention are discussed, debated and potentially implemented, such as the PACE exam, the PCCE exam, legislative monitoring, ethical policies, educational policies, and more. Each association in attendance is represented by a delegate(s). These delegates are given voting rights by their associations to discuss, debate and vote on any given policy. Policy meetings are governed by the NFPA President and Board of Directors and a registered Parliamentarian.

Attending the NFPA Annual Convention is a great way to learn more about the paralegal profession, earn CLE, meet new colleagues, discuss issues and new ideas, and if that's not enough, get involved. places for site seeing and restaurants downtown are within walking distance or a short light rail ride. There is also the McKinney Avenue Trolley close to the hotel with access to restaurants in "Uptown." \*\* Please Note – Do not illegally cross the street – please use cross-walks.

**Distance:** ~0.46 mi \* **Description:** UPTOWN. Hip, popular supper-club feel means that you'll be comfortable nibbling and drinking, listening to live music, showing off your style on the dance floor, or just relaxing with friends while jazz suffuses the place. Among the dishes you'll want to try are miso-glazed sea bass, Asian-style shrimp fettuccine, and Jamaican pork tenderloin.

#### **Lizard Lounge**

**Distance:** ~0.68 mi \* **Description:** DEEP ELLUM. Despite the name, you won't find lounge lizards holed up at this eclectic, high-energy club, where the weekend calendar depends on who's manning the DJ booth. One Friday, urban and hip-hop may hold sway over dance-floor denizens; the following Sunday, the lounge may host a fetish ball. Indeed, all genres of music get the limelight. Goth, classic industrial, R&B, rock B if you're into it, Lizard Lounge is the place for you! And if the action inside gets too heavy, a rooftop deck is perfect for catching a quick breath.

## **Ginger Man**

(Nightlife - Bars)

**Distance: ~0.86 mi \* Description:** UPTOWN. Set in a quaint house, the Ginger Man features an outstanding collection of over 70 tap and 100 bottled imported and domestic beers. An upstairs lounge, balcony and an inviting outdoor beer garden that often features live local talent give the place added appeal.

## **Stoneleigh P**

(Nightlife - Bars)

2926 Maple Ave, Dallas 75201 ★ 214-871-2346

**Distance: ~0.89 mi \*Description:** UPTOWN. Old pharmacy shelves and decades of charm serve as the calling cards for this old school Uptowner, which has been in operation since the early 70s and features excellent burgers and Sunday brunches. The bar was originally named the Stoneleigh Pharmacy but had to change handles due to an old city law requiring all pharmacies to be licensed.

**Distance: ~0.98 mi \*Description:** DEEP ELLUM. If you go (and you should), keep in mind that comedy isn't something done to you ... the cast needs and thrives on audience participation.

**Distance: ~1.01 mi \*Description:** DEEP ELLUM. A Deep Ellum long-standing honky-tonk, which has been popular since 1963. Adair's remains a rustic haven for folks who like to swill brew, listen to live music, and munch on good burgers. For history buffs, too, the joint holds an allure, courtesy of a jukebox

loaded with classics by Hank Sr. and Bob Wills, along with hundreds of framed photos and graffiti.

### **Gilley's Dallas**

**Distance:** ~1.20 mi \* **Description:** DOWNTOWN. In addition to live Country-Western acts, this spacious honky-tonk books everything from boxing to fashion shows. Owned by the award-winning entertainer and recording artist, this enormous venue was modeled after the equally Texas-sized original in the Houston suburb of Pasadena featured in *Urban Cowboy*.

**Distance:** ~.5 Miles \* **Description:** DOWNTOWN. Located on the Sixth Floor of the flagship Neiman Marcus store, the Zodiac Restaurant claims over 50 years of fine dining experience. It is described as a venerable dining destination.

### **Pyramid Restaurant & Bar**

(Restaurants - Lunch)

1717 N Akard St, The Fairmont Dallas, Dallas 75201 ★ 214-720-5249

**Distance:** ~137 ft \* **Description:** DOWNTOWN. Applauded for many years for its incredible cuisine and serene environment, The Fairmont's Pyramid Restaurant is better than ever. Outfitted with bronze, glass, walnut, mahogany, and lush fabrics, the contemporary Arts District restaurant gains added texture and form from dramatic organic art. The menu takes advantage of house-grown produce and homemade sauces, showcasing them in dishes like scallops with pancetta and chanterelles, a chili-rubbed rib-eye, Canadian lobster mac 'n cheese, and a West Texas antelope chop with butternut-and-mascarpone tortellini and a mushroom fricassee. A stylish bar and a chef's tasting room provide other venues for entertaining.

Romantics hold the place in high esteem as well, beguiled no doubt by its enchanting fountains and garden-like setting. Lunch appetites are soothed by dishes like tempura-battered fish and chips or three-cheese spinach lasagna; sandwiches, pastas, and seafood are available as well. N.B. Avanti is closed to the public at dinnertime and on Saturday and Sunday.

Extremely popular is the subterranean patio with its enchanting waterfall, outdoor bar, fire pit and gas heaters.

Menu items like veal marsala, veal piccata, New York strip, and prime rib of beef are all worthy options. Favored by business executives and players from the Mavericks and Cowboys, The Palm offers a casual yet refined atmosphere. The decor is unique: walls adorned with hundreds of caricatures of the rich, famous, and well-loved who've patronized the restaurant over the years.

In addition to the rudely funny jokes and puns, these servers also dish up tasty fried catfish and tangy BBQ, as well as burgers, steaks, and seafood.
