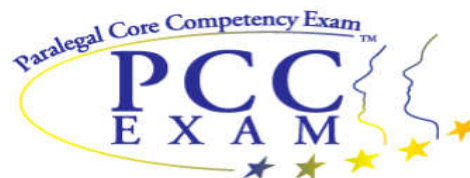

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## **Meet Your Paralegal Certification Coordinators by Vickie Newman, RP<sup>®</sup>**

Suellen's first term saw the development and implementation of the Paralegal CORE Competency Exam (PCC). She oversees all the coordinators.

For those who took the PCC beta test in June 2011, the first renewal will be due in June 2013. ## **NEW POLICY EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2013 REGARDING RESCHEDULING EXAM DATES by Suellen Honeychuck, RP®**

Prometric has expressed concern over the frequency of reschedules and cancellations of candidate appointments across all exam programs. In order to assure that there is adequate capacity in the centers, managing the process of scheduling and rescheduling appointments is critical to assure that all candidates can obtain a testing appointment on the date and time requested. Prometric reports that the rate of chronic cancellations has presented problems for fellow candidates who are not able to select their first, and in some cases, their second appointment choices. Prometric has revised its policies with regard to rescheduling/cancellation behavior in an effort to provide a first choice experience for all candidates

To better manage the issue, Prometric will institute **effective January 1, 2013**, a rescheduling fee. The fee will be applied as outlined below to all appointments scheduled for January 2013 and beyond. The fee will be assessed either at the Prometric website if the candidate reschedules or cancels online, or, by Prometric customer service if the candidate calls. **Payment of the fee is the responsibility of the candidate.**

- If a candidate reschedules or cancels 31 or more days before the scheduled test day, there is no charge.
- If a candidate reschedules or cancels 3 to 30 days before the scheduled test, the charge will be a portion of the total seat time fee for either the PCCE or PACE. The specific amount of the fee for each exam will be provided as soon as possible.
- If a candidate reschedules or cancels less than 3 days before the scheduled test date, the full candidate seat time fee is charged - **\$66.22 for PCCE and \$75.13 for PACE.**

The cancellation policy as it relates to no-shows or late-to-exam candidates remains the same.

## **Scoring Runs for the PCC Exam will be completed quarterly according the following schedule:**

## **RENEWALS TIME**

If you took PACE or PCC in an odd-numbered year, then 2013 is your renewal year. If you took PACE in the first part of the year (January through March), your renewal is now due.

The renewal form has been updated and revised. It is now a fillable pdf form for your use. Please use this form. It can be found on NFPA's website, at <http://www.paralegals.org/default.asp?page=60>

*Do not send* any handouts from your seminar, such as powerpoint presentations, and notes with your renewal application as this delays processing your renewal.

*Do not staple* your CLE certificates to your renewal application. The applications are now scanned. We are working on having your submit your renewals electronically and will let you know when this feature is available.

If you wrote an article, taught a class or was a guest speaker, you can get CLE credit for this. Approval is done by NFPA's CLE Coordinator. The form to request CLE approval is also found at <http://www.paralegals.org/default.asp?page=60>

### **CLE Coordinator Approval**

I've noticed recently that there are quite a few PACE Registered Paralegals® who work in non-traditional law settings, such as accounting, health, finance, banking or real estate, and need to maintain their licensing/certifications in these areas. If you attend a seminar that is geared for accountants, health, real estate, banking, etc. then you need to have this seminar approved by the CLE Coordinator. One way to tell if you need CLE Coordinator approval is if the seminar brochure says it granting credit for accountants, bankers, real estate agents, health care providers, etc. If it doesn't say "attorneys", then the CLE Coordinator will need to approve it. For example, you attend a tax seminar and the provider is an accounting company. This will need to be approved by the CLE Coordinator because the seminar's audience is geared for accountants and others in the accounting field, not the legal field.

### **Ways to Obtain CLE's**

As year-end will be here sooner than we think, there will be many ways to earn some much-needed CLE's. Paralegal associations will be hosting annual meetings and Fall/Winter seminars. Bar associations (both state and local) will be offering CLE's to their members to keep them in compliance with their state rules, some at discounted prices or even for free. NFPA has partnered with Lorman to obtain your CLE's. In addition, NFPA offers other on-line webinars that may be of interest to you, even if it's not in your practice area. In California, the State Bar recently offered a free ethics seminar to its members. Search your own state bar's website to see what they have to offer.

### **Recognizing Your CRP's and RP's**

Many associations will present CRP and RP pins to members who pass PCC and PACE at an annual meeting. They will also send out letters of congratulations to the newly minted CRP and RP and also congratulatory letters to their employers. But, what about those have held their designation for years? They should also be recognized for their commitment to maintaining their hard earned designation.

Many associations will list their RP's and CRP's on their website, on their PACE/PCC link. Note: Be sure to get permission first from the CRP and RP. If your association celebrates Paralegal Day or Paralegal Week, have a special lunch set apart for them.

At the main event, give out a certificate acknowledging their five year, ten year, or fifteen year anniversary date and mention it in your association newsletter. You can easily find the anniversary on NFPA's website, under the RP listing.

Here's a sample letter to send to a new RP's employer:

### Sample Employer Letter for new RPs/CRPs

Dear Employer:

Re: [name], one of [your state]'s newest PACE® Registered Paralegals/CORE™ Registered Paralegals]

As you know, [name] took and passed the [Paralegal Advanced Competency Exam/Paralegal CORE Competency Exam]. This is truly an accomplishment and demonstrates [name]'s dedication to continuing to develop professionally.

The PACE®/PCCE™ exam was created to provide a way to validate and measure an experienced paralegal's skills, and was developed using a professional testing company, Professional Examination Services (PES). Working in conjunction with PES to develop the exam was an independent task force comprised of paralegals, paralegal educators, attorneys, and members of the public. The steps for developing the exam included job analysis (including surveying 1,500 paralegals across the country to identify paralegal tasks), test item development (each question has a verifiable source), and beta testing.

The exam questions themselves are challenging. Questions are not merely "fill-in-the-blank" responses. Most of the questions are situational questions requiring the exam taker to know the rule or concept of law, analyze the facts provided, and apply the rule or concept of law in order to arrive at the best answer. While a study manual is available as a tool for studying, the exam itself covers much more than the manual provides. Any area of law may be on the exam, while the manual only covers a few of the most common areas of law.

Your firm can benefit by having an [RP®/CRP™] working for you in many ways. By taking the exam, [name] has broadened his/her knowledge base and likely increased his/her professional career satisfaction. This can benefit your firm by decreasing employee turnover. Marketing is another area in which having an RP/CRP on staff could benefit your firm. Are you trying to win over a new client? Promote the fact that [name] is a [PACE® Registered Paralegal/CORE™ Registered Paralegal] and has demonstrated his/her [advanced] skills in an independent, measurable way by taking the PACE®/PCCE™ exam. Currently, there are approximately 4,000 RPs in the nation, and only [number] in the State of [state], making [name] one of a select few.
