### **NFPA Announces Board Member Resignation**

Minneapolis, MN, June 7, 2021 – The National Federation of Paralegal Associations, Inc. (NFPA<sup>®</sup>) *The Leader of the Paralegal Profession*<sup>®</sup>, today announced that Lori J. Boris, RP<sup>®</sup>, MnCP, has resigned as President of the NFPA Board of Directors, effective June 15, 2021, in order to focus on personal obligations.

Lori has served the NFPA Board since 2016, previously serving as its Vice President and Director of Positions and Issues. In this role, she had many accomplishments, including presenting before the Minnesota Supreme Court on behalf of NFPA in support of Minnesota’s Legal Paraprofessional Pilot Project and overseeing the committee that was instrumental in convincing the American Bar Association to change its definition of a paralegal to no longer identify the term “legal assistant” as synonymous with paralegal.

Prior to being elected to the Board, Lori served as NFPA’s Certification Coordinator for Ambassadors, providing Certification Ambassadors from local associations with information and inspiration to encourage more paralegals to become PACE<sup>®</sup>-Certified.

Lisa Lynch CRP<sup>™</sup>, CEDS, President-Elect will assume the position of President and complete the current term, which concludes at the 2022 Convention & Policy Meeting.
